# National Council of Negro Women, Inc. (NCNW) National History

The National Council of Negro Women, Inc. is a council of national African American women's organizations and community-based sections. NCNW was founded in 1935 by Mary McLeod Bethune (1875-1955) who called together 28 national women leaders to form "an organization of organizations — a council." This "council" would represent the concerns of Black women, bring organizations together, and give Black women the opportunity to realize their goals for social justice and human rights through united, constructive action. Today the mission of NCNW is to lead, develop and advocate for women of African descent as they support their families and communities. NCNW fulfills this purpose through research, advocacy, and national and community-based services and programs on issues of health, education, and economic empowerment. **Rev. Shavon Arline-Bradley** is the current President and CEO.

#### **Capital Area Section of North Carolina – History**

"Coming Together Is A Beginning, Keeping Together Is Progress, Working Together Is Success" is the motto of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW)— Capital Area Section (CAS). This motto was the motivation for the vision of founders Christine B. Jones and Frances B. Grant who, in February 1997, established CAS.

Two years later, due to the unrelenting determination and strong leadership of founding members, the Capital Area Section was established. On April 24, 1999, a candlelight charter ceremony was held at Shaw University with 68 members in attendance.

We are proud to be celebrating 27 years of community service. Throughout the years, CAS has been blessed with many talented, dedicated and committed members who strongly embrace the needs of the community and work to advance the growth of African American women. This has been accomplished through committees and programs, such as Women's Center, Loaves and Fishes, and Raleigh Rescue Mission as well as other service projects.

The Capital Area Section is honored to have sponsored the charter of Shaw University and Saint Augustine's University Collegiate Sections in Raleigh, NC.

Dr. Paulette R. Dillard has a rich teaching history having taught biology for over 20 years at various institutions. Prior to her appointment as the 18th President of Shaw University, she served as Interim President and Vice President for Academic Affairs. During her tenure at Shaw University, she has served as the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Department Chair for Natural Sciences and Mathematics, and as an Associate Professor of Biology. She also served as Coordinator of undergraduate research infrastructure, and Co-Director of the academic enrichment programs for the National Institutes of Health National Institute on

Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD) funded Research Infrastructure in Minority Institutions (RIMI) project.

An avid researcher, Dr. Dillard and Shaw University student research interns spent six weeks in Kingston, Jamaica conducting a study examining the knowledge, skills, and attitudes of Jamaican men of African descent who were diagnosed with prostate cancer. This study was of interest to her as her postdoctoral research was focused on prostate cancer and its disparate impact on men of African descent. She has also worked as a visiting researcher at the National Institutes of Environmental Health Sciences in Research Triangle Park, published her research in peer reviewed journals, and presented at national and international conferences.

Dr. Dillard has over 25 years of experience in the field of clinical diagnostic medicine. She began her career as a bench scientist, and quickly ascended to the management ranks being one of only a few women senior executives, and even fewer women of color to reach the rank of Vice President and General Manager in the 1980s. Her ascension and success led her to strive to use her position as one of the few African American women executives to inspire young people to achieve. She has served on the Board of the Nashville Center for Black Family Life, which provided after school programs for children and youth as well as workshops to teach family life skills, and on the Hospital Corporation of American Center for Nonprofit Management Board to assist non-profit agencies funded by United Way with financial management. She has also BIOGRAPHY – DR . PAULETTE DILLARD mentored various students as an Executive in Residence at Paine College, Barber Scotia College and Middle Tennessee State University.

Dr. Dillard currently serves on the Board of the Carolina Small Business Development Fund, the Dorothea Dix Conservancy and has been involved with the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Center and the LaunchRALEIGH initiatives since inception. She also is on the Board of the Capital City Club and serves on the Raleigh Chamber of Commerce Board of Advisors. Dr. Dillard grew up in Mount Airy, North Carolina. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in biology at Barber Scotia College in Concord, North Carolina and received a Master of Science degree in biology from Tennessee State University. She went on to earn an MBA from the Jack Massey School of Business at Belmont University and a Ph.D. in Biological Sciences from Clark Atlanta University (CAU), Atlanta, Georgia.Dr. Dillard was married to the late Reverend Moses C. Dillard, Jr., a renowned musician, preacher, and social activist. She is a member of First Baptist Church, Wilmington Street in Raleigh, North Carolina.



## Honoree Dr. Linda R. Jordon

Dr. Linda R. Jordon was recently elected as Mayor for the Town of Butner, NC where she will oversee town staff that support approximately 8,000 citizens. Dr. Jordon is the first African American and African American female to serve in this role. She has been an elected official since 2007 when the Town of Butner for incorporated. In addition, Dr. Jordon is one of three African American entrepreneurs who secured a state contract to manage and operate a local Division of Motor Vehicles License Plate Agency located in Oxford NC.

Dr. Jordon is a highly sought-after international speaker, TEDx speaker, high performance coach, trainer and author. With over 30 years of professional leadership, Dr. Jordon created LRJ Coaching & Business Solutions, LLC to help women change their mindset and live their best life. Dr. Jordon inspires clients to illuminate their potential so they can have the life they deserve by focusing on enhancing their communication skills. She helps clients transition from corporate life to being their own boss.

Dr. Jordon is also a diversity and inclusion trainer/consultant in management, leadership development & training, leadership coaching, business process improvement, diversity and inclusion, contact center development & management, organizational development and training within the U.S. and abroad.

As a high-performance coach, Dr. Jordon works with individuals and professional leaders, helping them improve their communication skills so they can reach new levels of success. Dr. Jordon conducts leadership assessments with her clients such as the Maxwell DISC, Emotional Intelligence and MBTI. Dr. Jordon is a wife, mother and breast cancer survivor. She enjoys spending time with family, cooking and planting flowers. Jocelyn is a past president of the Capital City Lawyers Association, the African American Bar Association of Raleigh. She is also the former Second Vice President of the North Carolina Association of Black Lawyers. She currently serves as the Chair of the advisory board of the Southeast Raleigh YMCA and on the council of the North Carolina Bar Association's Military and Veterans Law Section. She also was appointed to serve on the American Bar Association's Task Force on the Changing Legal Profession. Jocelyn volunteers in the community through her membership in the Junior League of Raleigh and served as its parliamentarian during the 2021-2022 League year. She is married to Harold A. Mallette, who is an architect at Gensler, and she is the proud mother to Harold Henry and Everly Elizabeth, who are hilarious and lively toddlers.
